### Clocks go back on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> October

Reminder: our clocks go back by one hour on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> October, this will mean darker days travelling to and from school over the winter months. With this in mind, please encourage your children to wear something bright (scarf, hat or gloves etc) or carry a lighter coloured bag so that they can be seen easily and are safe.



### Parking

Please can I remind Parents/Carers, to park away from the school entrance so that everybody can get into our school safely. Please also be mindful of where you park, parking on pavements and the corners of roads can make it very difficult for pedestrians and families with pushchairs to walk along the pavement and cross the road safely.

Our neighbours of our school use their drives and there have been several reports of parents blocking drives so they can not get out to go to work or drop their own children off to their schools. Please think about where you are parking and be respectful to our neighbours.

### Cashless System: Bromcom

Now is the time for ALL Parents/Carers to ensure that you have signed up to our 'My child at school'. School will no longer be taking cash payments after half term and all communication will be through the app.

## Homework

We cannot emphasise enough how important it is to support your child with their weekly homework and daily reading. We, in partnership with you our Parents/Carers want to ensure our children enjoy and achieve throughout their time at Severne. Please ensure reading is recorded in your child's Reading Record Diary.

## Asthma and Medicines

If your child uses an inhaler at school, please pop in and check it is in date, (this is Parents/Carers responsibility).

An asthma attack can be frightening for young children, so please, please help us keep them safe and check their inhalers!

## Term – Time Leave of Absence.

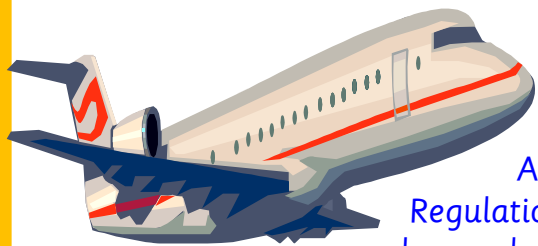
May we respectfully offer some clarity regarding Leave in Term - Time.

There appears to be some confusion for Parents/Carers regarding leave for holidays in term – time.

I can confirm that any leave taken for holidays will be recorded as un-authorised.



This code will be an unauthorised absence and will be pursued under the Fast Track programme, which again, may incur a fine under the BCC, Education Welfare Service Court Section.



All leave **must** be applied for **prior** to the leave being taken.

Amendment to The Education (Pupil Registration England) Regulations 2006, means that Headteachers may no longer authorise leave during term time apart from where the circumstances are exceptional. This is also in accordance with Birmingham Local Authority's 'Leave in Term Time Guidance'.

## **Leave taken without notice will be recorded as un-authorised.**

Please understand that this may lead to the issuing of a penalty notice and legal action being taken or your child losing their school place.
