Cyber Security Alert: Keep your accounts safe

Recently, there has been a big increase in online accounts being hacked. This means other people are getting into accounts without permission. Criminals are using smarter ways to guess passwords and trick people.

How can accounts be hacked?

Your account may not be safe if:

- Your password is easy to guess
- You use the same password for many accounts
- You save your password on shared devices (for example, school or family computers)
- You click on fake emails or messages that ask you to log in (this is called phishing)

How to keep your account safe

You can protect yourself by:

- Using a strong password (use CAPITAL letters, small letters, numbers and symbols)
- Not using personal information (like names, birthdays, or places) in your password
- Using a different password for each account
- Turning on two-step verification (a second check, like a code sent to your phone)
- Using face recognition or fingerprint login if your device allows it

Be careful of scams

- Do not click on links you do not trust
- If you think your account is not safe, change your password straight away
- Be careful of emails or messages asking for personal information

How to support your child

- Talk to your child about staying safe online
- Tell them not to share their password with anyone
- Ask them to tell you or a teacher if something online worries them

These simple steps can help keep your family's information safe and reduce the risk of accounts being hacked.





What time does school start?

School starts at 8:30am.

Parents/carers should arrive at school at 8:25am so that once the doors are open at 8:30am, children can make their way into their classroom, enjoy the breakfast snack that is being offered and prepare themselves for the day ahead.

This is a really important part of the school day and allows children to settle, join their class friends and make the most of every moment.

Being late results in children having to enter a classroom when everybody else is settled and learning has already begun- this often causes distress and worry.

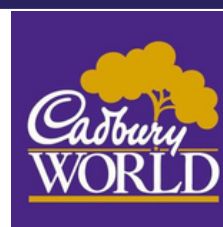

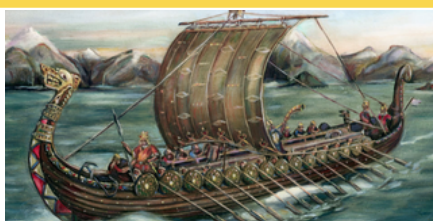
