



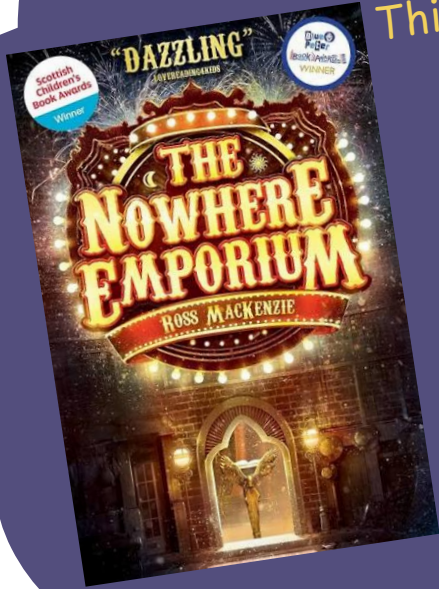

READING



This term we are going to be reading 'The Nowhere Emporium' by Ross Mackenzie.



WRITING

We will be learning and applying key Year 6 grammar, punctuation and spelling to extend sentences as well as consolidating the writing skills children have developed throughout their time at school. We will be writing a non-chronological report, diary entry and a description.



MATHS

We will be focusing on Place Value and the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). It is extremely important that children ensure they know their multiplication and division facts fluently, as this supports all of our learning in maths.



SCIENCE

Electricity: naming the parts of simple circuits

Light: how light travels and how we are able to see things.
