



A Safer Journey to Our School



WHY KEEP THE ZIG ZAGS CLEAR?

The zig zags are there for safety, they ensure clear sight lines for both motorists and children, as well as other road users outside school providing a clear area to cross more safely.

Stopping on the zig zag lines puts children at risk of an accident.

Because of their size children cannot see if the road is clear from behind parked cars.

Drivers cannot see small children hidden by parked cars.

When children go to and from school there is usually a lot of traffic.

All of this together increases the risk of an accident.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

If you need to drive, try to walk the last part of the journey and park away from school, this gives you the opportunity to teach your own children road safety.

Try starting this once or twice a week.

PLEASE

Don't park on the pavement and over drives, children are taught that the pavement is a safe place to be. It will also make it difficult for Parents/Carers with buggies and anyone who uses a wheelchair.

Don't double park or let children out of your car directly onto the road.

PLEASE BE AWARE

A camera car may be operating around schools at regular intervals to enforce parking restrictions issuing fixed penalty fines (£60) where necessary.



Walk to school whenever possible, including parking further from school and walking the last part of your journey

Please obey all road signs around our school site particularly any emergency access used for fire, police and ambulance service

Please do not park, drop off or pick up across the yellow zig zag lines (this is illegal and dangerous)

Do not park on the pavement

Please do not block residence drives (help us to be good neighbours).

Where possible walk to school with your child/children to help develop their road safety skills.
