I think you will agree that PE days are working well, cutting down on our children changing clothing (which often gets mixed up!!).

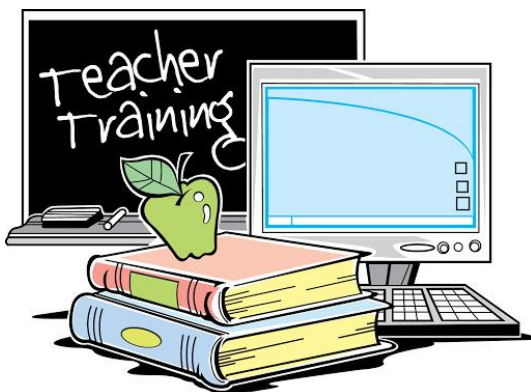
Finally... 'Friday Burgers' went well and our children enjoyed their meals. This is our first move back into hot meals so please watch this space for up-dates about meals.
